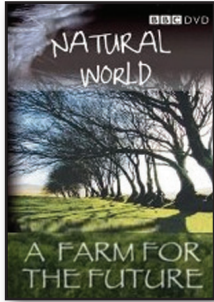

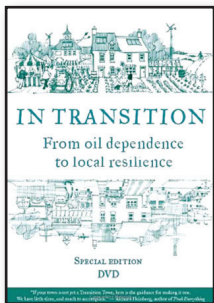
Laid back evening & bite size lunchtime films



A Farm for the Future

Wildlife film maker Rebecca Hosking investigates how to transform her family's farm in Devon into a low energy farm for the future. Realising that all food production in the UK is completely dependent on abundant cheap fossil fuel, she sets out to discover just how secure this oil supply is. Alarmed by the answers, she explores ways of farming without using fossil fuel. With the help of pioneering farmers and growers, Rebecca learns that actually permaculture holds the key to farming in a low-energy future. 50 mins. "Essential viewing" - Transition culture.

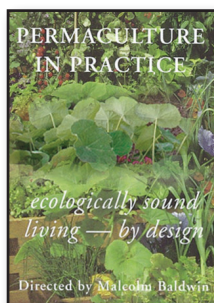


In Transition

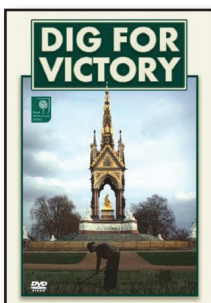


A Convenient Truth

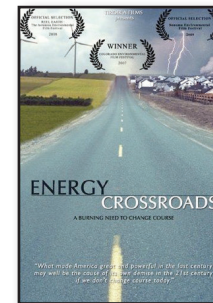


Beyond the Tipping Point

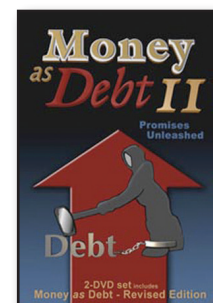


Energy Crossroads

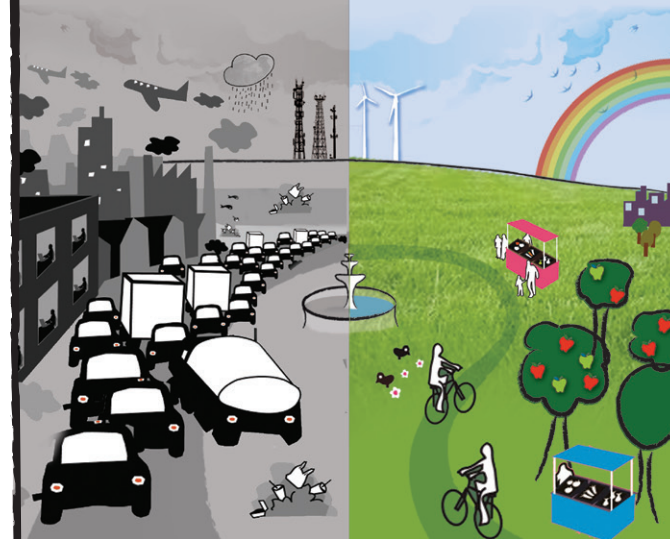
